
What's Happening

Book Review

Michael Rosen Getting Better

Penguin Random House 2023

Michael Rosen is a British poet, author and performer who has written more than 200 books.

His well-known children's book *We're Going on a Bear Hunt* inspired the Covid lockdown teddy bear hunt- which saw bears appearing in windows, waiting to be spotted by children on their lockdown walks.

In this memoir Rosen explores the roles that trauma and grief have played in his life. In 2020 Rosen contracted Covid-19 and was hospitalised, spending 40 days and nights in a coma. When he awoke, he was unable to walk or speak and had poor vision. Rosen examines how one can move forward after such life altering events. This moving memoir takes us through the moments in Rosen's life when he has struggled most. From job loss, chronic illness to coping with the loss of this his son. Rosen investigates the road to recovery asking how we can find it within ourselves to live well again after- or even during- the darkest times in our lives.
